FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN.....

As often as I have walked through Livsey Park in North Fairhaven with my 'bestest-bud', dog Noah, I am always struck by the now empty and crumbling structure that is the former Oxford Elementary School. Ghostly, it sits adjacent to this quiet and peaceful expanse of land. I am once again saddened at the changing landscape of my beautiful seaside town, as more and more neighborhood schools make way for the larger and better equipped learning centers that are required to meet today's educational standards. But this is the school *my* children attended so many years ago, seemingly another life-time ago. My mind's eye sees clearly those little faces, hears their laughter and excitement as they greet me at the end of the school day, feel their hands in mine and those hugs that could take my breath away. Back then, I am sure I wondered how I could ever live without all those special, private, and precious moments that were mine alone to treasure. I see little bodies running toward me and I am swept away with emotion. But they are 'today's children at the playground.....and I am jolted back to my reality. For a brief moment I ache for my babies, as though I had just said goodbye to them. But Noah is here with me and we walk on, enjoying a beautiful fall day.

I think of some the 'goodbyes' in my life: when I left my family to attend college, when I moved away to a new church parish, when I held my dying father's hand, when my youngest and final child moved away. Goodbye feels so final and loss can hamper the possibilities of what the future can and does hold. But as a 'grammy' of four, I have come to realize that with sad goodbyes come glorious hellos, daily surprises, and new life. Maybe *goodbye* is just another word for *change*.

As hard as it is to say goodbye to our Curate, Malia I am reminded of the wonderful journey she is pursuing. I suggest that her opportunity to move on with this new and exciting endeavor become our opportunity as well.

Try to imagine sitting with Jesus at the last supper. How would *you* say goodbye? I don't think Jesus would welcome a last goodbye. Perhaps 'see you later'? The God I love doesn't mean finality. Each time I am at the Eucharist there is a healing and preparation for the continuing journey of life, a preparation for the future, and the comfort that God's love overwhelms all the goodbyes that have been and are to come.

We can't always get what we want in this life, but as people of faith I believe our loving God gives us all that we need. Bill Bradbury always reminds us that we have each other to share both our burdens and blessings along the way. With each new change we encounter along that way is the opportunity to become new again, see the world differently, and open our hearts to new possibilities. Let's be surprised, together...that my friends, is good news!

VESTRY HAPPENINGS

Tower Report: As of September, the current work of drilling on the tower shows there are two voids (gaps in the walls). Additional anchors need to be installed. A meeting to discuss the work thus far took place on September 28th which was attended by the Vestry, the structural engineer, architect, and Team Property.

Treasurer's Report: A bequest from the estate of Janice McKeachern was received in the amount of \$678,182.98. Ms. McKeachern's gift specifies the following:

--it be deposited into the Endowment Fund and administered by the Trustees of Parish Funds, with the restriction that none of the principal derived from this gift may be invaded, only the interest which accrues may be used. The interest from this share shall be distributed in the following manner: 1) 10% to the Grace Episcopal Church Food Pantry. If the food pantry ceases to exist this amount would be added to her gift to the Scholarship fund, . \$68,000) 2.) 30% to the Scholarship Fund, in memory of Janice McKeachern (\$203,000) 3.) 60% to Grace Episcopal Church for it's unrestricted use of the interest (\$407,000).

VOTED to receive the request and authorize the Warden, Paula Cabral, to execute the receipt that was sent to the accountant and to her by Attorney, Janet Miranda.



On Sunday November 13th, during the 10am service, we will say goodbye to our Curate, the Rev. Malia Crawford and wish her God's speed as she departs for her new position as Rector of the **Church of Our Savior** in Arlington, Massachusetts.

Malia has been a beacon and a blessing to all of us and our ministries here at Grace over these past three years, and while her leaving will definitely create a void in our parish family, we want to wish her every success in her new position as Rector.

November Services

Though **All Saints' Day** is actually November 1st, we celebrate it on the first Sunday of the month November 6th. Thus the color will be white, and we will be using the readings for All Saints instead of the Twenty-first after Pentecost. It is also one of the rare occasions when we use Eucharistic Prayer D, an adaptation of one of the most ancient Eucharistic prayers. It is a Sunday when we honor the souls of everyone past and present. There will be slips to fill out in the weeks before All Saints on which you can write the name of a loved one who has passed away or anyone who is or was a saint in your life; the slips will be collected and brought up at the offertory. The names of all who have died in the parish in the last year will be read at the service. It is one of the feast days when baptism occurs; there will be several baptisms including that of Malia and Amy's new son Isaiah.

The next weekend is the **Twenty-second after Pentecost**. November 19 and 20 is the Last of Pentecost, the Feast of Christ the King, and, at Grace, **Harvest Sunday**. It is the tradition at Grace to decorate the altars with the fruits of the harvest, a tradition that dates back to the earliest days of our parish. One of the oldest photographs of the chancel of this building, shows it decorated for this Sunday. On this Harvest Sunday Bishop Gayle Harris will be visiting us.

The last weekend of November begins the church calendar year. It is the **First of Advent**, a season we will learn more about in next month's article.

On Wednesdays in November, we will continue with the **Gathered in Grace** service at 7:00 a.m. and Holy Eucharist and Healing service at 10:00 a.m. at which we will be celebrating **All Souls' Day**, on November 2nd; **Charles Simeon**, Priest, on November 9th; **The**

Consecration of Samuel Seabury, the first American Bishop, on November 16th; and **C.S. Lewis**, Apologist and Spiritual Writer, on November 23rd.

On **Thanksgiving Day**, Thursday November 24th, Holy Eucharist will be celebrated in All Saints' Chapel at 10:00 a.m.

Lay Liturgical Ministers

On Acolyte Sunday, October 30, 2011, Lay Ministers who have joined the ranks of the **Acolyte and Lay Minister Guild**, or have advanced to another ministry in the last year, are recognized. In addition Lead Acolytes **Courtney Botelho, William Boyce, Damien Montague, Leslie Monteiro**, Lector **James Vincent**, and Chorister **Melissa Botelho** have become Eucharistic Ministers. Eucharistic Minister **Allen Decker** has been trained as Subdeacon. There are now a grand total of 64 active lay liturgical ministers in the guild, including 46 active Acolytes. (In addition there are over 20 "Acolytes Emeriti" who are no longer active, some of whom serve occasionally at holidays or when they are home from college.) There are five Subdeacons, 23 Eucharistic Ministers, most of whom are also lectors, and 11 other lectors. Many Lay Ministers have more than one rôle but are only counted once in the grand total. We thank all our Lay Ministers and Acolytes for their devotion and service at the altar and to the congregation. Special thanks go to the acolytes who helped to train and mentor our new acolytes.
